


Fibre-to-the-home (FTTH)












Mobile Network Coverage – end of April 2016















Voice Population Coverage: Outdoor 99% + Indoor 77%

Data Coverage (3G)






Data (3G): Population Coverage: Outdoor 99% + Indoor 80%

Coverage Investment – Galway County



- In 2015, we invested in Galway County by adding:
 - Improved voice and high speed data coverage county-wide by adding over 40 new 2G and 3G sites
 - Superfast 4G sites to Ballinasloe, Loughrea, Salthill and Tuam enhancing data coverage and speeds.
